ORIGIN mid 16th cent.: from Latin **contribut-** 'brought together, added,' from the verb **con-tribuere**, from con- 'with' + **tribuere** 'bestow.'

give, donate, put up, subscribe, hand out, grant, bestow, present, provide, supply, furnish;

informal chip in, pitch in, fork out, shell out, cough up, kick in, ante up, pony up.

supply, provide, submit.

notice or perceive (something) and register it as being significant; make a remark or comment; perform or take part in (a rite or ceremony).

ORIGIN late Middle English : from Old French **observer**, from Latin **observare** 'to watch,' from **ob-** 'toward' + **servare** 'attend to, look at.'
